


# CHASS First Gen Profile

## Total Population of First Gen Undergraduates

The first gen population has grown faster than average within the college


## Original Entry Type

## Freshman Graduation Rates

Graduation rates have been at or above the university averages for recent incoming cohorts of first-time, full-time freshmen



## Who counts as first gen?

We define first generation using the reported highest education of a student's parents or guardians. If the student indicated that neither parent/guardian held at least a four-year college degree, we consider them first gen. Those who provided no information on parental education are not considered first gen (these make up about three percent of recent undergraduates).

## Distribution by Ethnicity

First gen students are much more likely to be Chicano/Latino


## Distribution by Gender
